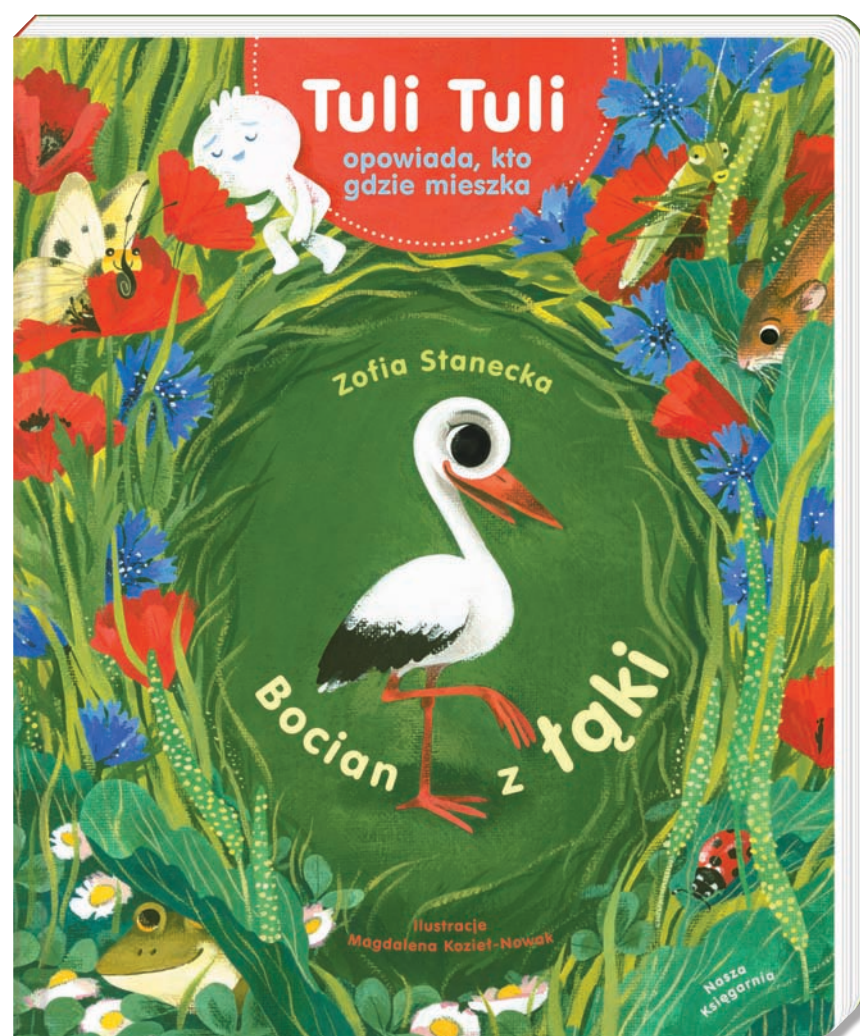


Meadow Stork

Felix and Gustav Learn about Jobs

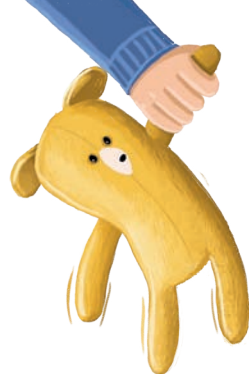

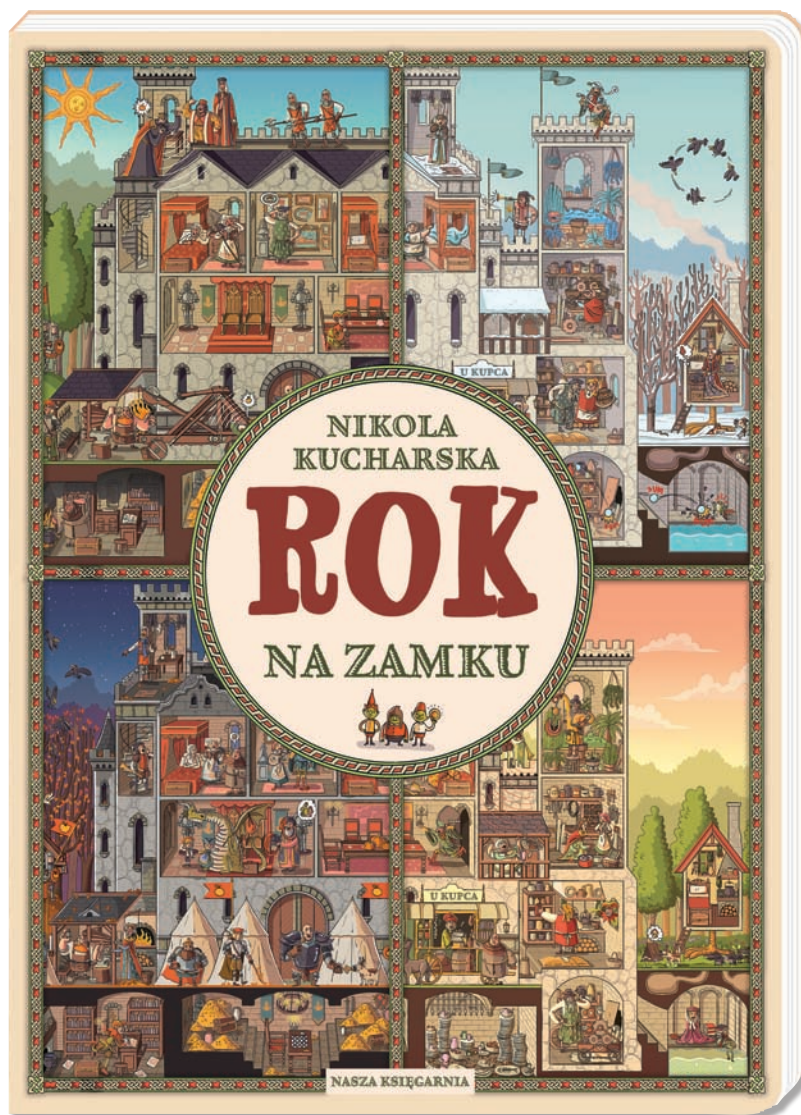

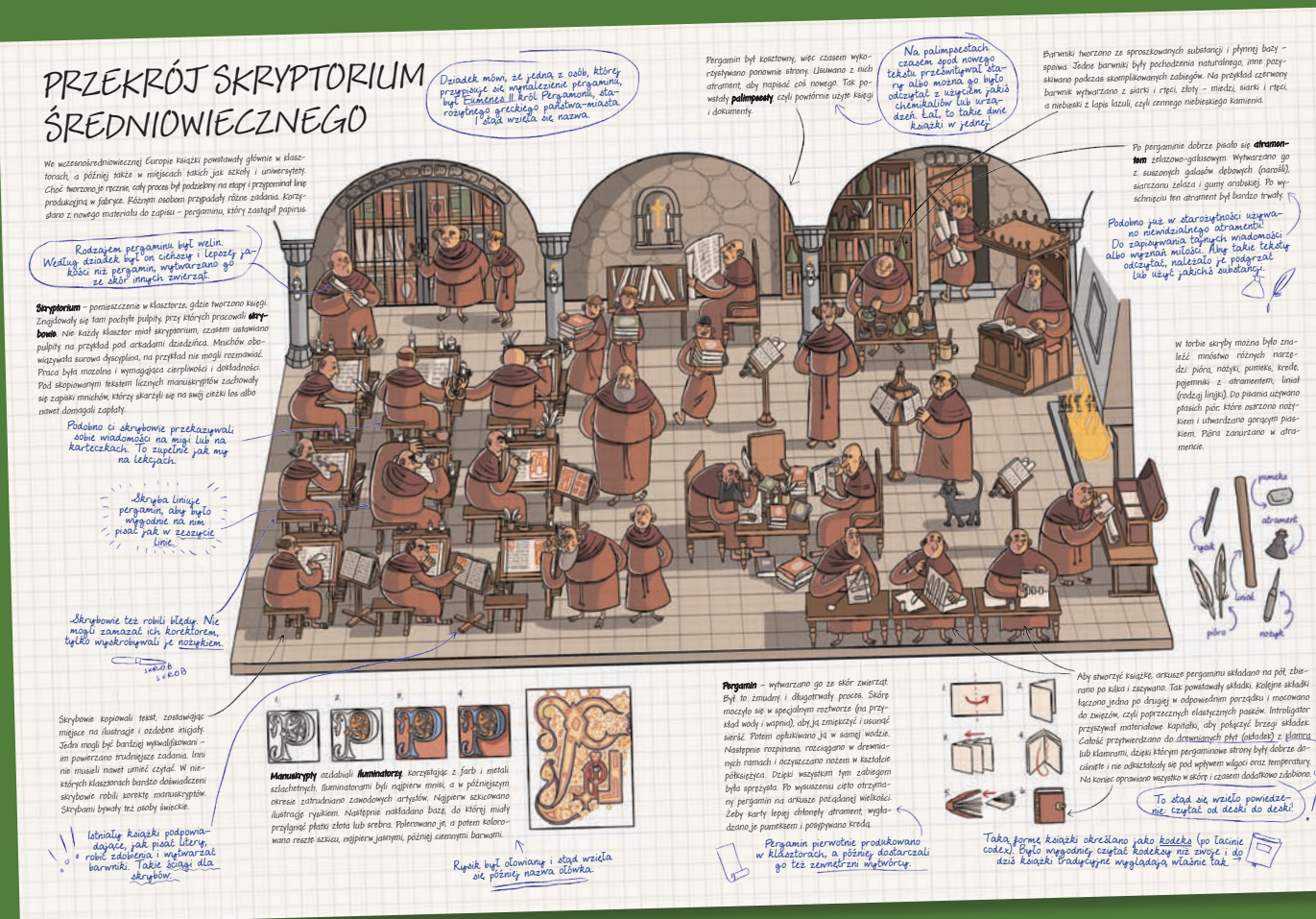

Medicine – though not necessarily as we understand it today – has accompanied humans from the very beginning of our history. People have always got ill and tried to relieve discomfort. They examined, tested, experimented and observed. Some methods of combatting ailments turned out to be effective, others were harmful and dangerous. But all, in one way or another, have contributed to the development of medicine.

- Who first dared to look inside the body of a deceased patient?
- What were the first surgical instruments made of?
- What were anatomical theatres?
- What elements are humans made up of?
- What was laughing gas used for?
- What examination is made difficult by claustrophobia?

You can find answers to these and many more pressing questions in this fascinating book by the researcher and populariser of science Anna Bartosik. The content is complemented by Asia Gwis's beautiful illustrations, which also contain additional information.



Aspiryna

Już w czasach starożytnych Egipcjanie znali cudowne właściwości **kory wierzby**, która zawiera kwas salicylowy. Przygotowywano z niej wywary i napary zwalczające ból i gorączkę oraz zapobiegające stanom zapalnym. Naukowcy bardzo długo badali, co dokładnie odpowiada za te wspaniałe właściwości. Pod koniec XIX wieku **Felix Hoffmann**, bardzo zdolny chemik pracujący dla firmy chemicznej Bayer, otrzymał w laboratorium tę samą substancję, która jest obecnie w korze wierzby, i nazwał ją **aspiryną**. W ten właśnie sposób po raz pierwszy w historii naukowcy stworzyli w laboratorium lek na podobieństwo substancji występującej naturalnie, a firma stała się światowym liderem w jego sprzedaży. Mimo że w ciągu wielu lat stosowania aspiryny okazało się, że nie każdy może ją bezpiecznie przyjmować, jest to najczęściej wydawany lek w aptekach na całym świecie. Rocznie zużywamy około 100 miliardów tabletek. Jeżeli przyjmiemy, że naszą planetę zamieszkuje 8 miliardów ludzi, to każdy w ciągu roku połyka przynajmniej 12 tabletek aspiryny!
